
I've been surrounded by people who want me to achieve

Dan & Rob's Top Tips

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How to make the most out of your placement



Be prepared

Have your CV handy and make sure it's up to date.

Do your homework.

Having knowledge about companies you're interested in will help you make a good impression at the careers fair and during interview.

Make sure you pick up a copy of the careers fair programme.

It will list names and contact details of the companies attending.

Get involved:

Meeting new people can be nerve racking but push yourself out of your comfort zone and go for it!

Speak up

Be honest and deliver on your promises. If you're struggling or feeling overwhelmed don't be afraid to speak to someone about it.

Get stuck in.

Take every opportunity you can. Ask Questions. Build connections. Remember - the more you learn about the more you can add to your CV afterwards. It will also help you better understand your strengths and weaknesses and which career might be best for you.

There are no stupid questions.

Take everyone opportunity to learn more: more about the company, more about the industry, more about people's experiences with the job market. Knowledge is power and this is a great time to gain a lot of knowledge.



Organise your letters of recommendation.

Post-internship it can be tricky to get in touch with your old colleagues who could be too busy to get your letter to you when you need it. Get them done while you're still there. You'll thank yourself for it later.
